Frequently the church will pull texts out of a passage and misuse it to make a point that the Bible doesn't support. I'm not smart enough to figure out that kind of hooey and have no desire to go get the church training to be able to understand that sort of thing.

Jesus came to mind when I wrote that last statement. He didn't attend the schools of his day so he didn't receive training at the hands of fallible humans. His heart and mind was open to the teachings of the Holy Spirit. By listening to his Father he gained a knowledge of God and heavenly things that the erring humans rejected.

Who do I want teaching me? A christian institution that is passing along falsehoods and brainwashing you in the process or do I want the Holy Spirit teaching me? I'll follow in the footsteps of Jesus and let the Holy Spirit teach me.
